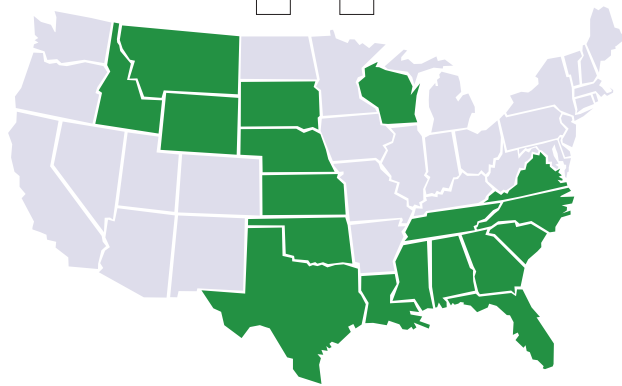

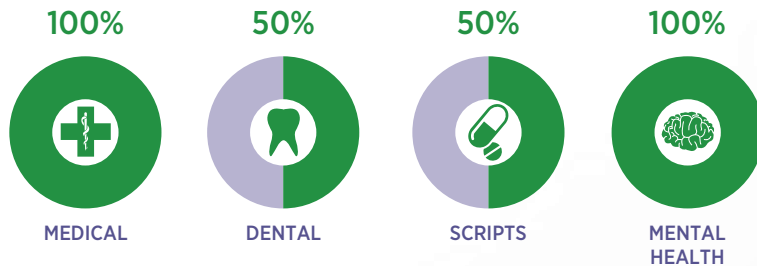
Free and Charitable Clinics provide quality care for those who need it most.
